#### **ICE CREAM SOCIAL RETURNS!**

The Perkins House Ice Cream Social, on COVID hiatus since 2020, returns this June with some exciting new features, as well as some old traditions. The Social has been held nearly every summer since the founding of the Whitman County Historical Society in 1972, on the last Sunday in June. This year's Social, however, will be held on Saturday, June 17, from 1:00 to 3:00 <u>PM</u>. Its theme will be "Sundaes on Saturday."

Theresa Dale, a member of the ICS Committee, said that attendees will be able to pick from three basic types of ice cream, which they can then garnish with a variety of toppings. #### **Parnell** Ceremony

About forty people attended the Memorial Day dedication of the monument for Sheriff Levi Morton "Pete" Parnell (1888-1949) in the Colfax City Cemetery on Monday, May 29, including a large contingent of law enforcement officers. Parnell was killed in Pullman by sniper George McIntyre on Easter Sunday in 1949. Funding for the granite monument (center of photo) was provided by **Gary** and **Trudy Libey** of Colfax, and by **Pat** and **Norm LaPalme** of Jacksonville, Florida.

#### <u>Roof Restoration Springs Forward</u> <u>at the Pullman Depot Heritage</u> <u>Center</u>

Big changes have been taking place at the Depot! Although it has appeared to have been lying dormant since its purchase by WCHS in 2018, its volunteers have been working tirelessly to raise funds and secure grants. That work is coming to fruition, thanks to numerous generous donors.



The building, which sits on the north bank of the Palouse River, was slowly deteriorating. Changes made in the past 18 months have included repointing many of the building's bricks and replacing of some of the original foundation stones. Tiles for the roof arrived earlier than expected, on April 3, and work started immediately. Layers of decades-old roofing were removed and are now being replaced by green clay tiles identical to those that graced the structure between 1916/17 and the early 1950s. Further exterior work will include gutter and soffit additions, restoration of window casements, and the return of the exterior doors to their original green color.



#### Successful Vintage Quilt Show at the Depot

Over 125 people attended the second Annual Vintage Quilt Show at the Pullman Depot Heritage Center, which ran weekends from April 21 to May 6. Some 40 quilts—all between 50 and 120 years old—filled the Freight Room and the Passenger Car, along with examples of crocheted lace doilies and other vintage handiwork. A big thank-you to each of the volunteers who set up and took down the show, to the Appaloosa Bobbin Lace Guild for demonstrating their art, to Doug Meyer and Greg May for making new quilt display frames, and to the following county residents who generously loaned their heirloom quilts and handwork items: Francis Benjamin, Jennie Carlson, Cathy George, Val Gregory,

The spotlight for June/July 2023 is on **Don** and **Teresa Myott** of Palouse, who started volunteering at the Roy Chatters Boomerang Print Museum 15 years ago. At first, they helped with exhibits, advertising, and a variety of other things, such as the permanent display on the remaining pillar that supported the trestle for the Spokane and Inland Empire electric train that once ran through Palouse. More recently, since his retirement after 34 years with the city of Palouse, Don has been going through old newspapers



every Saturday, making note of items such as obituaries, wedding announcements, and local events that might be of interest to genealogists and historians. For example, in April he found an article in the *Palouse Republic* that described a game that the Harlem Globetrotters were playing against the Palouse town team. At least two books and several journal articles have been written by authors who have made extensive use of Don's research.



Teresa is also retired. She taught special education K-12 and in grades 1-4 for 33 years in Idaho and still does a lot of substitute teaching. A long-time community volunteer for numerous organizations, in particular she has spent 21 years with Needful Things Thrift Shop in Palouse, which supports the Community Center and various activities and events that take place there. For the Print Museum, Teresa photographs Don's finds and often prints them or emails them to people who are interested in them.

When asked why they donate so much of their time to WCHS, Don said, "It brings me joy." Teresa said that community involvement is very important to her. "We're all part of the community we live in, and we need to support each other."
