Some 30 members attended the WCHS Annual Meeting, which was held on Sunday afternoon, October 8, at the historic Steptoe School. Tours of the building, now 115 years old, preceded the meeting. (Steptoe is the oldest school in continuous use in the state of Washington.) The main business of the meeting was electing officers and board members for the coming year (see page 1 of this newsletter). The afternoon's program, which was presented by **Kathy Meyer** (Pullman), was entitled "Early Schools and Teachers in Eastern Washington." Veterans' Day Program Postponed

Due to the recent natural gas line crisis—which affected southern Whitman and Asotin counties in Washington, as well as parts of Latah and Nez Perce counties in Idaho—the "Fallen Cougars" program planned for November 9 at the Pullman Depot has been postponed. WSU history professor **Raymond Sun**, who is in charge of the project, has tentatively rescheduled the program for Thursday, May 23, 2024.

Although most of Colfax's Winterfest activities will be held on Friday, Dec. 1, the Perkins House is hosting an Open House from 10:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. on Saturday, Dec. 2. Come see the house, which is beautifully decorated with Victorian-style ornaments.

Thanks to **Jill Gfeller** (Thornton), outreach coordinator for the Perkins House, a rare set of "Original Dickens Dolls," handmade in the 1940s and 1950s, will be on display. The dolls tell the story of Ebeneezer Scrooge and Charles Dickens' famous tale, *A Christmas Carol*.

Pullman Holiday Festival

This year's Holiday Festival in Pullman will be Saturday, Dec. 2. It starts with the **Kiwanis Pancake Feed** at Lincoln Middle School (7:00 to 11:00 a.m.), which will feature a delicious breakfast, music, and a silent auction.

The **Depot Train Car Bazaar** (see next page) will run from 10:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. in the passenger car at the Depot. While you're there, be sure to take in the decorated Freight Room.

The **children's Yule Jog Fun Run** will start at 4:00 p.m. Runners should meet in the parking lot next to the YMCA. The run will end in the parking lot at the Depot, where Santa will be arriving "by train" at 4:30.



After holiday carols led by men from several WSU fraternities, the group will march to Pine Street Plaza to watch the **tree-lighting ceremony** at 5:00. Afterward, free s'mores will be available at Paradise Creek Brewery.
